# **Bookkeeper Position**

#### Responsibilities:

- Utilize Google Sheets and Gmail to convert sales numbers into checks.
- Set up the spreadsheet before the show, updating last year's data with new participant information.
- Manage the show laptop for efficient data processing.
- Use Square to track show sales and generate reports for each potter's daily sales.
- Email daily sales reports to potters by merging the spreadsheet and our email list.

#### Post-Show Duties:

- Compile final numbers for the spreadsheet at the show's conclusion.
- Collaborate with the show chair and treasurer in the week following the event to write and mail checks to participants.

#### Qualifications:

- Experience with Google Sheets and Gmail.
- Experience with Square for sales tracking.
- Detail-oriented with strong organizational skills.
- Ability to work independently and meet deadlines.
- Excellent communication and collaboration skills.

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## 3 Interesting Pottery Facts:

- Pottery has been around for a long time and is found in nearly every civilization in some form. The potter's wheel was invented in Mesopotamia between 6000 and 4000 BCE, bringing pottery to the next level as potters could craft their wares more quickly and efficiently, with more symmetrical and even shapes.
- Ancient Egyptians used pottery during the embalming process. Egyptians used jars, sometimes ceramic and sometimes wood or stone, to hold the organs of the departed after they were embalmed. They believed the person would need their organs in the afterlife, so the stomach, intestines, lungs, and liver were all stored in canopic jars.
- Traditional Japanese pottery takes up to a week to fire. For thousands of years, traditional Japanese clay art has been fired in chambered wood kilns called anagama (one-chambered kiln) or noborigama (multi-chambered kiln). The fire is kept burning 24 hours a day for as long as a week and then left to cool for several more days. The process is so labor intensive potters often only fire their work once a year.
